

Dale L. Diedrich


Dale L. Diedrich, 73, of Pepin, WI died Saturday, June 21, 2014 as the result of an automobile accident. He was born November 4, 1940; son of Eunice (Wilke) and Henry Diedrich.



Dale graduated from Athens High School, Athens, WI in 1958 and attended University of Wisconsin-River Falls. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture Education in 1962 and was then employed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

he married Donna C. Gebert at Zion Lutheran Church in Stetsonville, WI. In August 1963 Dale was hired by Pepin High School to re-establish the Agriculture Department. He continued his education and earned a Master of Science degree in Teaching in 1968. He then began working for the University of Wisconsin Extension as a 4-H Youth Agent. In 1971 he was hired by District 1 Technical College (Chippewa Valley Tech) in Eau Claire, WI where he taught until his retirement in 1998. In 1985 Dale became part of the People to People International cultural exchange tour to China during which time he gave an agricultural presentation at Beijing University.



Dale enjoyed hunting, fishing and farming, especially growing giant pumpkins. He was a member of the Pepin Sportsman's Club and the Pepin Lions Club.
